the Gardai are well aware, Ballymun is only a mile and half radius of land with roughly
16,000 people.
The CPAD movement was forced to take action in the past and if nothing is done via the police, might have to be looked at again as way to shame and rid these dealers from
Ballymun. The effect of gifting youth drugs to snare them as streams of money for dealers
over time is getting out of hand. Too many of our youth whose families have lived in poverty
for generations are heading to school (education being the main way out of poverty) with
debts to dealers and the threats of knocking / busting into their family home stressing them out, which inhibits them from focusing on school / learning.
